By way of punishing you for your over timidity & action in the above business (which was the more extraordinary as you knew I was not an austere man) I enclose you a \_\_\_\_\_ \_\_\_\_\_ which is for articles for half the negroes on the plan-=tation, & so till I see you at Hampton take care of yourself & your mother Your kids are big enough to take care of themselves. Adieu
